

# **Revised Phase-In Options**

## **Expectations for Return**

- All school buildings will open
- All buildings have state required health professionals
- Transportation can be provided for all students who have requested it
- A partial in-person experience can be provided to every student who selected one
- Safety protocols (ex., physical distancing, face coverings and frequent cleaning) will be in place
- The number of students served each day in-person will be limited by building capacity due to safety protocols and staffing
- Special Education and English for Speakers of Other Languages Services will continue to be provided
- Academic Supports and Interventions will continue to be provided
