Off-Year CIP: Keeping our Major Projects Whole



The Superintendent's Recommended FY 2026 Capital Budget and Amendments to the FY 2025-2030 CIP totals \$1.853 billion, the same amount as the approved CIP.



\$21.6 million is needed in new local funding to address revenue shortfalls.



Off-year CIP Amendments focused on keeping major projects on track by addressing increases and completing build-out of site and project elements.



Amendments reallocate funds to support key priorities and minimize impact on local resources in the off-year.



There are additionally no major CIP changes in the FY 2026 request.



Foundational work is underway to plan and prepare project scopes and priorities for a larger CIP request in FY 2027.



Boundary Study Update

- Since the preliminary work session, the team met with a diverse group of internal and external stakeholders to review upcoming steps and timelines
- RFP submissions received through October 31, 2024
- Vendor evaluation process underway
- Comparison of 2019 boundary analysis and current boundary studies
- More information, such as Frequently Asked Questions, and other resources will be posted on the MCPS Planning website in the coming weeks
- Vendor recommendation to be prepared for Board action on November 21, 2024

CIP Hearings Follow-up

- Scheduling meetings to visit schools that articulated needs
- Strategic approach to supporting schools with facility needs that fall outside of the CIP
- Implementing formative communication and engagement with schools with construction and renovation projects
- Reassessing approach to project management at schools under construction
- Updating our Facilities Conditions Index to make data-driven decisions
- Developing a detailed six-year systemic plan covering all infrastructure components

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
